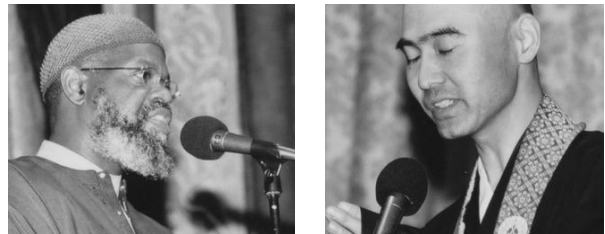


The Interfaith Center of New York and our partners invite all social work students and practitioners to join us for a *free* course on
