Dear Mr. President:

We write to you as national leaders to express our support for the reauthorization of the U.S. Commission on International Religious Freedom as it has been configured since its inception and to express our concern about a recent legislative proposal (HR 2867) that would significantly reduce the number of Commissioners appointed to the Commission from 9 to 5. In addition, we would ask the Congress to restore the full funding of the Commission, or if cuts need to be made, to ensure it has the resources to do its work. We do not believe the current House proposal provides those levels.

It is essential that the Administration recognize the importance of maintaining a Commission that reflects the diversity of America's religious communities. In particular, we are concerned that a reduction in the number of Commissioners could result in the exclusion of voices from minority religious communities. These Commissioners advise the Administration and Congress on critical issues of international religious freedom that, in turn, affect diverse religious communities worldwide. The Commission is more productive in its current form and more able over the years to have its membership drawn from diverse communities than it would were it reduced in size.

Furthermore, the Commissioners serve in unpaid positions and a reduction in their number will not have a commensurate effect of saving a proportionate amount of government spending. Commissioners do not have staff working for them individually, nor do they have offices at the Commission. The reduction proposed in HR 2867 would disproportionately and unnecessarily cut back the Presidential appointees as well.

We urge you to support reauthorization of the U.S. Commission on International Religious Freedom to maintain the current size of the Commission, and to ask Congress to provide full funding so it may continue its important work.
