

Support New York State's Freedom of Information Law (FOIL)

CAIR-NY, the Muslim Community Network, the Association of Muslim-American Lawyers, and the New York Coalition Against Islamophobia call on Mayor de Blasio to order the New York City Police Department ("NYPD") to comply with New York State's Freedom of Information-Law ("FOIL") and to stop giving "Glomar responses" to questions about unlawful surveillance. In recent years, the NYPD has increasingly relied on "Glomar responses"—the CIA tactic of neither confirming nor denying information's existence—when questioned about its unlawful surveillance of the Muslim community and other activists. Talib Abdur-Rashid and Samir Hashmi have been fighting the NYPD's responses in a case that is now going to New York's highest court, the Court of Appeals. Activists, journalists, and civil libertarians all depend daily on FOIL to investigate police abuses and to act as citizen watchdogs.



A survey on discrimination and integration of Muslims in the U.S.



Dr. Pratibha Kumar, Professor of Communication at Mount St. Mary's University in Maryland, has been teaching Islamophobia and media's negative portrayal of Muslims and Arabs in media classes since 2012. Her research interest also focuses on Muslims in America, and she is conducting a study on discrimination and integration of Muslims in the U.S.



Grants from Queens Arts Fund



Queens Arts Fund offers grants \$1,000-\$5,000 to community organizations that offer cultural programming to a Queens audience. Through a competitive application process, that is judged by a peer panel process, nonprofit organizations or community organizations working with a fiscal sponsor are encouraged to apply.

The Queens Art Fund supports Festivals, Street fairs where there is a cultural component, Concerts, Traditional arts presentations, Art exhibitions and Film festivals. The Queens Arts Fund pays for cost related to the program including Arts activities taking place in Queens in 2018, artist fees, direct administration costs, marketing and publicity cost as well as supplies and materials needed for the execution of the project.

| July 4 | INDEPENDENCE DAY |

| | Anniversary of the United States Declaration of Independence in 1776. |
| July 9 | MARTYRDOM OF THE BÁB • Bahá'í |
| | Observance of the anniversary of the execution by a firing squad in Tabríz, Persia, of the 30-year-old Siyyid 'Alí-Muhammad, the Báb, the prophet-herald of the Bahá'í Faith. |
| July 13 | ULAMBANA • Buddhist |
| | Buddhist Ghost Festival. The unsettled spirits of dead ancestors are calmed with chanting and offerings to enable them to pass peacefully into the next world. |
| July 15 | DHARMA DAY • Buddhist |
| | Also known as Asala Puja, it commemorates the historical Buddha's first discourse following his spiritual awakening. |
| July 13–15 | OBON • Buddhist |
| | Also known as Bon, the Japanese Buddhist festival honors the spirits of past ancestors. |
| July 26 | ADA (AMERICANS WITH DISABILITIES ACT) DAY |
| | Commemorates the 1990 signing of the Americans with Disabilities Act, which guarantees equal opportunity for people with disabilities. |
