Workshops will be led by ICNY staff and expert training partners, including: the Center for Court Innovation, Faith in New York, the Mayor's Community Affairs Unit, Mayor's Office of Immigrant Affairs, Center for Faith and Community Partnerships, CUNY-CLEAR, and the New York City Police Department.
