Message from ICNY Executive Director

Dear Friends,

Please join us one week from today for ICNY's Gala celebration at the Tribeca Rooftop at 6:30 pm. <u>Tickets</u> are still available for the <u>2018 James Parks Morton Interfaith Awards Dinner</u> on June 11th at the Tribeca Rooftop. We hope to see you there!

At a rally in New York City in response to news earlier this month that Homeland Security has separated over 700 children from their parents seeking asylum on the South West border, ICNY's Program Associate Hanadi Doleh said,

"The Interfaith Center of NY is . . . horrified at the practice of separating immigrant families as they seek a better life in the United States. The profound importance of family unites us all across faith lines. Speaking personally as a Muslim during the holy month of Ramadan, I would ask our immigration officials to remember the words of the Prophet Mohammad, peace and blessings be upon him, who said that 'keeping relations with family members prolongs one's life and increases one's sustenance.' "

Senators Charles Schumer (212-486-4430) and Kirsten Gillibrand (212-688 6262) need to hear more from us about immigration and sanctuary. As Hanadi concluded, "with the wisdom of New York's diverse faith traditions in mind, we call on ICE to stop all family separations in New York and around the country."

Shaema Alomari is a fifteen year old girl from Yemen with severe cerebral palsy whose case had been cited in the oral argument at the US Supreme Court against the current Travel Ban. After having been denied entry into the U.S. for medical treatment, her family was granted a waiver just days after the Supreme Court argument gave it publicity. After landing at JFK Airport in NYC last Saturday, the Yemeni American Association welcomed Shaema and her family, greeting them with flowers, balloons and a crowd of supporters and reporters.

As Ramadan winds down there are a few more interfaith and public iftar Ceremonies. These include, the Office of the Brooklyn Borough President's iftar, Thursday June 7th and also on June 7th, the LGBTQ community center Iftar

The Psychotherapy & Spirituality Institute joins with The Interfaith Center of New York to offer a summertime continuing clinical education certificate program in spiritually-informed psychotherapies. This program gives qualified professionals providing mental health or pastoral care services an opportunity to undertake structured and sustained study of key intersections between spiritual wisdom and psychological insight.

In a seminar setting, students will consider a wide array of topics relevant to practice including intimacy, family life, diversity, addictions, conflict, grief, and trauma incorporating spiritual perspectives into each area. A brief final integrative paper will allow students to apply what they have learned to their own work. This program is meant to enrich professionals' clinical practice and deepen their understanding of how spiritual dynamics figure in holistic care. 18 CEC's are available to LMSWs, LCSWs, LMFTs, and LMHCs in New York State. Graduates of the summer certificate program will become PSI alumni and program affiliates.

Faith-Based Lobby Day for Bail Reform





Project Harmony - English Camp in Jerusalem -Looking for Volunteers of Different Faiths

Project Harmony, with two locations - in Jerusalem and in Wadi Ara - is seeking full-time General Counselors, Athletics Specialists, and Arts Specialists for Summer 2018. Project Harmony (www.projectharmonyisrael.com) is an immersive English language summer camp for youth of all religions, which works in collaboration with the Hand in Hand network of Arab-Jewish integrated schools in Israel.

Project Harmony English Camp will run from June 24-July 26, 2018, from 8:30 am-3:30 pm. The first week is devoted to staff training, and camp is in session Sundays through Thursdays during the month of July. General Counselors will be responsible for a group of 10-12 kids ages 9-14 at all times, guiding them between activities and ensuring that they are safe, engaged, and having fun. The position is unpaid, but can be used for college credit.

Project Harmony is not able to pay a stipend for our volunteers at this time. We do, however, provide as much logistical help as possible in the form of optional group travel and lodging packages and support from our fundraising team to help defray the costs of your trip.



The Centro Pro Unione Summer School in Rome

The Centro Pro Unione Summer course is designed to introduce participants to the ecumenical and interreligious movements from a Catholic perspective. It will offer a historical and theological overview of the issues that divide Christians as well as the bonds that unite them.

The course, which is in English, is for men and women who are in preparation for ministry or religious life, who are in the mission field, who are ecumenical officers or members of ecumenical commissions, or who are looking for a sabbatical experience led by qualified professors and ecumenists.

The cost of the course, which earns up to 6 graduate credits, is US\$300, which is payable at the time of application. Upon acceptance of application, a list of possible lodgings in Rome will be mailed or faxed. Booking of lodging is the responsibility of applicant. The theme of the 2018 Parliament is "The Promise of Inclusion, The Power of Love: Pursuing Global Understanding, Reconciliation, and Change." More than 10,000 people will participate in the Parliament, which will last for seven days and comprise more than 500 programs, workshops, and dialogues, alongside music, dance, art and photography exhibitions, and related events presented by the world's religious communities and cultural institutions.

June Full Month LGBT+ PRIDE MONTH

Commemorates the anniversary of the June 28, 1969 Stonewall riot in New York City, the incident that initiated the modern gay rights movement in the United States. Pride Day is the

last Sunday in June.

June 10 RACE UNITY DAY • Bahá'í

Observance promoting racial harmony and understanding and the essential unity of

humanity.

June 11 LAILA AL-QADR • Islamic

"The Night of Power" marks the night in which God first revealed the Qur'an to the Prophet Muhammad. Often fixed as the night before the 27th day of the Islamic month of Ramadan, Sunnis may also observe it on the 21st, 23rd, 25th or 29th. Shi'ites observe it on the 19th,

21st or 23rd of Ramadan.

June 12 ANNE FRANK DAY

Birthday of young Jewish girl whose diary describes her family's experiences hiding from the

Nazis through assistance of gentile friends.

June 12 LOVING DAY

Observes the anniversary of the 1967 United States Supreme Court decision *Loving* v.

Virginia which struck down the miscegenation laws remaining in 16 states barring interracial marriage.

June 14 FLAG DAY

Anniversary of the adoption of the Unites States flag by Congress in 1777.

June 15-17 EID AL-FITR • Islamic

The "Feast of the Breaking of the Fast" marks the end of Ramadan, the holy month of

fasting from dawn until dusk.

June 19 JUNETEENTH

Originally commemorating the announcement of the abolition of slavery in Texas in 1865, it is now celebrated throughout the U.S. to honor African-American freedom and achievement.

June 20 WORLD REFUGEE DAY

Raises awareness about the plight of refugees and displaced persons.

June 21 FATHER'S DAY

Children of all ages show appreciation for their fathers and father figures.

June 21 SUMMER SOLSTICE

In the northern hemisphere, the longest day of the year. It marks the first day of the season

of summer.

June 26 ANNIVERSARY OF LEGALIZATION OF SAME-SEX MARRIAGE IN THE UNITED

STATES

On June 26, 2015, in the case of Obergefell v. Hodges, the Supreme Court ruled that the

fundamental right to marry is guaranteed to same-sex couples.
