Happy June. This month starts off on a positive note, as ICNY's very own Hanadi Doleh, Program Associate for Community Partnerships is honored by NYC Comptroller Scott Stringer's Office at his Community Eid Celebration at the Islamic Center of NYU! More info here.

We are grateful that the Separation of Children Accountability Reporting Act cosponsored by Sen. Brian Benjamin and Assemblymember Harvey Epstein passed the Senate last Friday. The SCAR act asks foster care agencies caring for separated children to report on how many children are in their care. See ICNY's Op Ed in the New York Daily News for more information. We need your help in the next two weeks. There is a long way before this bill becomes law.

Across the five boroughs, there are reasons for concern about increasing instances of vandalism and bias crimes inflicted on diverse houses of worship and communities of faith. This past month saw hateful, anti-semitic communications from a Staten Island group expressing their rage at members of Chabad Hourse who had moved from Brooklyn and sought to put up an eruv. All are welcome to join a meeting this Thursday, June 6 at 7pm at Temple Emanu-EL (984 Post Ave, Staten Island). This is a meeting of the newly-formed Staten Islanders Against Anti-Semitism. Also, the Sung Tak Temple in Chinatown was attacked last week and sustained damage up to tens of thousands of dollars of damage in sacred objects, according to the Chair of the Buddhist Council of New York. Tragically, the same perpetrator had vandalized another Chinese Buddhist Temple in Flushing earlier this winter. Please keep these communities in your prayers.






### A Conversation with Anne Klaeyson & Steven Waldman on 'Sacred Liberty' June 5
