With the new beginnings inspired by the month of September, the Interfaith Center of New York is pleased to announce a new partnership with New York Law School. This Fall, ICNY will be offering religious diversity training for NYLS law students and attorneys who seek to work with diverse clients including those from immigrant backgrounds. Stay tuned for more information about this initiative made possible by a grant from Arthur and Diane Abbey.

We have also joined the steering committee of a coalition of faith-based social service agencies committed to doing outreach for the 2020 Census so that no one goes uncounted and that New Yorkers of all backgrounds get the representation and federal support that they and their communities need to flourish. With the opening of the 74th Annual UN General Assembly, the Foundation for Climate Restoration invites you to participate in the <u>First Annual Global Climate Restoration Program on September 17th at the UN Headquarters</u>. In addition, on September 20th a coalition of youth groups, including Fridays for Future NYC, Zero Hour, and Earth Uprising, will answer the call to action with the youth-led <u>Global Climate Strike</u>, demanding an end to the use of fossil fuels.

Finally, the <u>Newark Catholic Action for Immigrant Children and other faith</u> <u>leaders will be holding a protest on September 4th</u> outside the Elizabeth Detention Center in Newark. In light of continued deportations, detentions, family separation, and a new <u>USCIS policy ending deferred action for migrants receiving life-saving treatment</u>, we encourage you to join us.
