As a founding member of the White House Covid-19 Community Corps, ICNY is doing its part to combat vaccine hesitancy in diverse religious communities across New York City's least vaccinated neighborhoods. We are proud to partner with NYC Mobile Vaccine Bus, which will be bringing both Johnson & Johnson and Pfizer shots to Jamaica and Harlem.

At the Jamaica First Ward Meetinghouse of the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-Day Saints, in Queens, a doctor from Jamaica Hospital will answer questions about the COVID vaccines, while local faith leaders including Bishop Dustin Joyce and Vijah Ramjattan of the United Madrassi Association (both former ICLA Fellows) will discuss the importance of vaccination for their communities. The event is on July 14th and you can sign up to attend the panel and get vaccinated here.

Likewise, the Mobile Vaccine Bus will be available outside the Mosque of Islamic Brotherhood at [130 West 113th Street](#) from 12-8 PM on Friday, July 16th, and Masjid Aqsa Salam at [23 E 115th](#) before and after Jumma Prayers on July 23rd. Stay tuned for more information about vaccine availability at the annual Harlem Cheikh Amadou Bamba Parade organized by the Senegalese Sufi Mouride community of New York on July 28th.
