

Tragic Fire at Temple Na-Ri-VéH

For the past 25 years, Temple Na-Ri-VéH has provided social services and spiritual support to community members in the heart of Port-Au-Prince. The Temple's significance cannot be overstated. Since the earthquake that devastated Haiti in 2010, four families and seven children have called the temple home. Its walls have given them refuge through Haiti's tumultuous recent history.

On the evening of August 24, 2021, these families and children lost their homes in a tragic fire. Portions of the Vodou temple -- the spiritual heart of the compound, containing rare Haitian art and sacred objects -- were also destroyed. The results of this disaster have been devastating.

Temple leaders are asking those with the means to help them rebuild, and ensure that Temple Na-Ri-VéH continues to serve the needs of these families and the community at large. 
Two workshops available for NYC religious leaders:
