# ICNY Welcomes Two New Board Members



## Elder David Marriott

---

Elder David Marriott of The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints is a distinguished litigator renowned for his experience handling high-stakes disputes across federal and state courts and administrative agencies. He is a fellow of the American College of Trial Lawyers and the International Academy of Trial Lawyers. He also routinely receives accolades from the legal press for successfully representing clients in precedent-setting matters. David leverages his trial skills and strategic acumen to guide clients in business-defining litigation involving Antitrust, Intellectual property, Securities, Environmental matters, and Complex commercial issues. David advises across a broad range of highly scrutinized industries, including technology, healthcare, pharmaceuticals, consumer products, and telecommunications. In addition to his practice, David is an Adjunct Professor at New York University School of Law and a Lecturer in Law at Columbia University School of Law.



## Rabbi Sharon Kleinbaum

Rabbi Kleinman served for 32 years as Senior Rabbi of Congregation Beit Simchat Torah in New York City, the largest LGBTQ+ synagogue in the world — for people of all sexual identities and genders — where she is now Senior Rabbi Emerita. Rabbi Kleinbaum was installed as CBST's first rabbi in 1992, arriving at the height of the AIDS crisis when the synagogue was in desperate need of pastoral care and spiritual leadership. For many years, Rabbi Kleinbaum has been ranked by Newsweek among the 50 most influential rabbis in America. The BBC also named her one of its 100 Women of 2024. She has long been involved in the fight for human rights for all people and was appointed by President Biden as a Commissioner to the United States Commission on International Religious Freedom. She is a Commissioner on New York City's Commission on Human Rights and served on Mayor Bill de Blasio's Faith Based Advisory Council. Rabbi Kleinbaum is also a member of the Executive Committee of Governor Hochul's Office of Faith and Non-Profit Development Services.

# ICNY'S IMPACT FY25

## JANUARY 2025

On January 16th, ICNY hosted a half-day consultation at Union Theological Seminary in partnership with Jewish Theological Seminary entitled “Faith Communities Against Mass Deportation.” There, over 100 attendees heard from faith and legal experts (including **ICNY Board Co-Chair Ruth Messinger**, **The Rt. Rev Matthew F. Heyd**, **Episcopal Bishop of New York**, **NYCLU’s Donna Lieberman**, and **NYU Immigration Law Clinic Director Alina Das**) between opportunities to network and solidify neighborhood-based rapid response networks.

ICNY joined the **Chicago Imams Council** and **Muslim Advocates** to submit an Amicus brief in a court case supporting the protection of sensitive sites like schools, hospitals, and houses of worship from immigration enforcement.

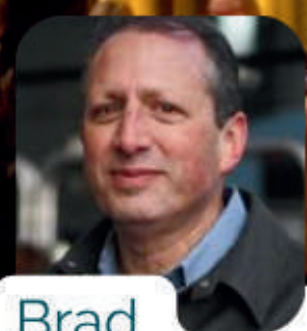

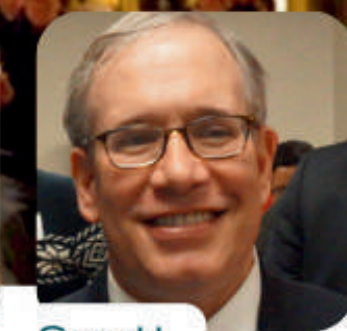

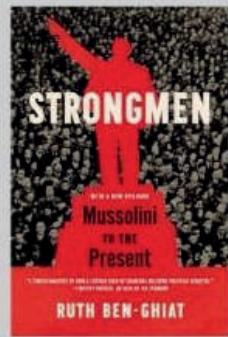

When Mayor Ras Baraka and two Members of Congress were apprehended by Federal Agents while attempting to exercise their oversight responsibilities at Delaney Hall Detention Facility, ICNY mobilized to join NJ-based faith leaders and activists in a multi-week presence to condemn the conditions and lack of due process for people being detained inside the facility. We continue to stand with **Pax Christi NJ** and **Faith in NJ** as we seek to provide a prophetic presence for employees and bear witness to the egregious violations of due process.
